

STUDENT PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT


Success at school and excessive part-time work are fundamentally incompatible. As a place of learning, our College must assume that a student's education is first priority. Working excessive hours (greater that 15 hours per week) places learning success in jeopardy. If students are to have the best chance of educational success, so broadening their life choices for employment, part-time work must be limited. We are seeing a number of our older students almost falling asleep at school after late night shifts, as well as then trying to use their part-time work as an excuse for not submitting set tasks or bringing correct equipment.

These related excuses will not be accepted by the College so our usual penalties will continue to apply. Please discuss this important issue with your student pointing out that, while the money may be nice now, it is unlikely to help them with school success ane later career choices.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The College expects that all students will wear appropriate uniform each day. If a student is out of uniform they should bring a note to explain why and then get a uniform pass from the front office. Repeated failure to wear appropriate uniform will result in detention being imposed.
